WiCII Provider Education Meeting Tuesday, March 9th, 2020

Attendees: Anne, Gail, Nicole, and Naomi Kowald

- Would like to explore whether it makes sense to partner on statewide MOC-4 module on developmental screening.
- WSMHI had at one time explored MOC-4 for this, may be time to revisit this since it has been identified as a priority
- Waisman has funding through WiCII to develop module and pay for provider credits
- Developmental screening is a part of WHCQ, but not yet well-established – data on this is hard to pull from EHR
- WSMHI already offers MOC4 for shared plan of care – Arianna Keil can provide more info on the process
- If we do develop MOC4 for dev screening, we would want to develop in a way that it could be more broadly than just providers at participating WiCII clinics
- Is there a way to have WSMHI do the trainings and then have WiCII coordinate the QI activities? May make sense for us to partner in this way.
- Would need to figure out how data collection would work – most clinics do not document screening in their EHR in a way that is easily pullable.
 - WCHQ had a data collection mechanism that may be useful
- Offerings through ABP expire toward the end of the year – new offerings will be available at that point. Screening will still likely be a topic but don't know for sure.
- WSMHI SPOC MOC4 does measurement prior to training and 6 months after training – could build off of that
- Naomi has meeting with Geeta regarding developmental screening this afternoon and can explore whether WSMHI would want to be involved in the development of a developmental screening module for MOC4
- An advantage of developing a WI module is that we can tailor and broaden out to autism and behavioral screening in addition to dev screening
- Nicole will share the pathway document with Naomi
- Anne is going to look at the application form for MOC-4 to see what is involved in pulling a module together
- Would be ideal that MOC4 be set up that it could be tailored to the needs of the clinic based on what they're already doing
 - May just want to focus on getting in compliance with the screening guidelines
 - Gail will share article on proportion of clinics that are in compliance with guidelines
- WSMHI trains a mix of clinic specialties
- Waisman could develop a menu of training options that clinics could choose from based on what is relevant to their needs.
- Naomi will check in with Geeta and Leah to see how this type of module would fit in with WSMHI goals and priorities.
- MOC2 requires additional/more in depth learning questions than CME
 - Need to clarify requirements of and differences between MOC2 and CME
- Not asking WSMHI to do anything additional/develop new materials, but want to coordinate trainings so we aren't duplicative
- Nicole will send Naomi the list of participating clinics; Naomi will let us know when providers from participating clinics reach out to WSMHI

- Might be valuable to have a way for providers to measure screening for the national performance measure
- We will circle back in April – Nicole will set something up
