WiCII Provider Education Meeting Agenda Wednesday, December 2, 2020, 10-11a

Attendees: Gail, Nicole, Anne, Leah, Naomi

Action Items from December meeting:

- a. Nicole and Gail will coordinate planning meetings for developmental screening training efforts related to the new HMO regulations
- b. Nicole, Anne, and Danielle will work to determine best course of action for CME for DGR
- c. Nicole, Gail, and Danielle will continue to plan format/content of DGR

Notes:

- a. General Updates:
 - i. Danielle Scholze (Developmental Pediatrician on the WiCII project) will be joining these meetings. Her time on WiCII is increasing to 10% - will be working on Developmental Grand Rounds (DGR), may pull into planning around new HMO regs
 - ii. Arianna has resigned from her WI, Sharon Fleischfresser is retiring as of 1/14/21
 - iii. CARE training – Nicole, Gail and Meredith provided input to Becky on one module, WiCII offered to support efforts to improve accessibility to medically underserved families. However, efforts to connect with these families have not been successful so far
 - iv. Site visit tool – hard to determine how useful this tool is at this point because clinics are so swamped they are not interested in working on anything that is not required at this point
 - v. Gail has been familiarizing herself with implementation science – would be helpful to apply implementation principles to more systematically approach improvement of screening practices in WI
- b. Developmental Grand Rounds
 - i. Nicole submitted application to ICEP regarding CME for DGR – Nicole and Danielle are meeting with ICEP on 12/4. Naomi also determined that we can pursue CME through MCW (\$750 per year, must submit 90 days ahead of time)
 - ii. Gail sent email to Joanna Bisgrove (new family practice physician on the Act Early State Team) regarding collaboration on DGR
 - iii. Danielle and Gail met with Kia regarding partnering with WIAAP on DGR – WIAAP will collaborate on content and presenters; Kia is also able to provide guidance on what will work best in terms of format
 - iv. First DGR will provide updates on new screening guidelines, data on WI screening rates (very poor in WI), and provide guidance on screening implementation. DGR will supplement existing trainings, not replace them. DHS does have some existing state data, there is likely national data available as well – need to highlight that progress has been made since 2016
 - v. Will want at least 2 months to advertise DGR – January is not likely a feasible start date
- c. Distance Learning
 - i. UW Dept of IT is exploring coordinating the use of the same LMS platform for online classes - Canvas Catalog (a toolkit that includes registration & payment system, as well as environment for actual classes)
 - ii. Post-COVID we will likely continue to rely on distance learning more than pre-COVID, need to consider implications for future trainings
- d. Continuing Ed Credits
 - i. For CE, need to consider how participants access credits and registration/course content and streamline as much as possible (ICEP and MCW each have their own platforms)
 - ii. Waisman is exploring whether it is worthwhile to become its own CE provider – WiCII could support this effort financially
- e. HMO Regulation changes re: developmental screening

- i. Naomi and Leah attended meeting regarding HMO training requirements regarding developmental screening – seems to make sense to curriculum and offerings available across multiple HMOs
- ii. Naomi scheduled a meeting to discuss coordination around new HMO Dev Screening training requirements for 12/18
- iii. The new HMO requirements likely are foreshadowing upcoming changes to CMS core set requirement in the next couple of years
