- Reaching out to medically underserved families
 - Learning from families group – not doing the family listening groups in Milwaukee, focus is on Madison
 - Becky – Equity group with Katie Hamm is going well so far. This upcoming Monday group will meet in small groups. Good plan for 2021, will re-evaluate at the end of the year whether it makes sense to continue into 2022
 - Lynn – WI Integrated transition project has discussed issues of people who are unconcerned in their biases or racism and act as gatekeepers within the system. Katie Hamm may be a good fit for this group's needs
- Gail connected with Brigit about the video fact sheets (making them available in Spanish)
 - Would need both translation of text in slides and a native Spanish-speaker to provide audio
 - Brigit is moving forward on making the first video fact sheets in Spanish (genetics), still working on costs (WiCII will pay)
 - Discussed evaluation strategy – may involve getting input before finalize the fact sheets and then some input once disseminated
- Robert Wood Johnson grant – Hector Portillo's org, Padres e Hijos, obtained funding for stakeholders from the Latino community working with health care providers to co-create solutions for health equity. First year involves funding for training and stress management activities – may be opportunities to translate, co-create to make them more culturally accessible
- Becky – 1st pilot of the Caring for the Whole Family – positive feedback from the focus group afterwards
- Gail – drafting final offer letter for the bilingual/bicultural hire for the Southern Regional Center – Claudia. Part of her role will be training.
- Becky – Powtoon and Goals Cards at goalsforchildren.wisc.edu launched in March – piloting for CLTS waivers but open to anyone. Resource families to help clarify and align goals for IEP, CLTS, shared plan of care
 - This may make sense to share with Act Early State Team – future bright spot?
